Parish Church. Origin C.13 but very much restored. In churchyard base and part of pillar of ancient cross.

I Manor House

Origin C.13 with adds. in C.16 and alterations in C.19. 2s. crsd. rbl., approx 2'6" thick in old parts, with attic. Mod.fenestration except those described below. Welsh sl. rf. Existing plan rect. l.a. N-S with 2 unequal-sized projections on W. with a lean-to between them. The C.13 bldg. was a first-floor hall type and this was remodelled with add. in C.16. The C.13 solar was on first floor N. side and retains 2 lancet w. in N. wall; from the solar opens a garderobe with early st. basin and drain. On the N. side above this solar is an attic with an early C.13 2-light w. in N.gbl. with probably C.16 rf. timbers. At N.W. angle is an early chimney-like shaft (Parker says C.14 but possibly C.16) which is octagonal on a sq. mld. base and has a battlemented cresting, the fireplace to which has gone (or it may have been a vent to the garderobe). Int:- much modernised but fittings include a C.16 st. fireplace in gd. fl. room and some mld. ceiling beams. Mod. staircase in centre at back. attic dorms. in hipped rf. on  
S. front. Crsd. rbl. with  
ashl. qu. Three sash w.  
Tiled rf. Sq. in plan with  
lower add. on W. S. front has  
mld. doorway with broken ped.  
and a bold mld. and modillioned  
cornice. In garden to N.E. of  
house is an ancient brick dovecote,
